


Ambassadors for Jesus represent Him in this chaotic world by:


- 1. Living with integrity within ourselves.

Differences Between Ancient and American Slavery

- Race played no role
- Education was encouraged
- Slaves could own property (including slaves)
- Same cultural traditions
- No laws against slaves publicly assembling
- Majority emancipated by age 30
- S.S. Bartchy, "Slavery (Greco-Roman)"

Slavery in the Ancient World

- Different types
- Between 25-40% of ancient population was slaves
- Temporary condition on path to freedom
- Many voluntary slaves
- Former slaves did not seek abolition
- Often, household slaves better off than freedmen
- Had high positions in home and government
- Viewed as property with no rights
- Inciting a revolt was suicidal


